

NEBRASKA GAME, FORESTATION AND PARKS COMMISSION

NOTES

The only legal method of taking fish is with hook and line with the following exceptions:

Carp, buffalo, suckers and other non-game fish may be speared between sunrise and sunset from April 1 to December 1, except in restricted areas.

Catfish of legal size and non-game fish may be taken from the Missouri river with seines, hoop nets or trammel nets under special regulations with proper commercial permit.

Carp, buffalo, suckers and other non-game fish may be taken with hook and line at anytime without limit on size, bag or possession.

It is unlawful for anyone to angle with a line having more than five hooks thereon or to angle in any inland waters with more than fifteen hooks in the aggregate or with artificial bait having thereon more than three triple gang hooks.

Snagging any fish externally with hook and line is unlawful whether game or non-game fish.

All persons sixteen years of age or older must have a fishing permit for the current year. All non-residents must have a fishing permit for the current year, regardless of age. Short-term non-resident permits are available. They are reciprocal with other states with a minimum of \$3.00 for a ten-day permit.

It is unlawful for any person to borrow or use the permit of another or to lend or transfer his permit to another. TOTAL BAG AND POSSESSION LIMIT—No more than twenty-five (25) game fish of all kinds combined may be taken in any one day, nor more than twenty-five (25) game fish of all kinds combined may be had in possession at any time; provided, however, that this regulation shall not apply to perch that are taken in Cherry, Brown and Rock counties where there is no bag or possession limit on perch.

DAILY BAG LIMIT means fish taken from midnight to midnight.


POSSESSION LIMIT means fish in the possession of any person at anytime.

AREA OPEN—Where "entire state" is open, this does not include private lakes closed to the public or areas closed by any Federal or State law or City ordinance.

LENGTH OF FISH—The "total length" of a fish shall be used when determining the size limits. Total length shall be found by measuring from the tip of the nose to the tip of the tail.

RETURNING FISH TO WATER—All fish caught that are under the legal size limit as specified herein, and all fish legally taken that are not to be counted in the bag limit, must be returned immediately to the water with as little injury as possible.

SALE OF FISH—No species of fish may be sold from private fish hatcheries in Nebraska, except trout, for purposes other than propagation, and where sold for propagation, invoices furnished by the Commission must be used and a report made to the Commission covering all sales at the end of each quarter of the year.

STATE-OWNED LAKES

Special fishing regulations are in effect on the following State-Owned lakes:

Arnold lake, Custer county; Blue river recreation grounds, Seward county; Champion lake, Chase county; Cottonmill lake, Buffalo county; Cottonwood lake, Cherry county; Crystal lake, Adams county; Camp Hayes lake, Hayes county; Dead Timber recreation grounds, Dodge county; Fremont sandpits, Dodge county; Jefferson County recreation grounds; Bowman lake, Sherman county; Memphis lake, Saunders county; Niobrara park lake, Knox county; Pawnee lake, Webster county; Pibel lake, Wheeler county; Platteview lakes, (Louisville) Cass county; state-part of Rat and Beaver lake, Cherry county (Only a small part of this lake is state-owned); Ravenna lake, Buffalo county; Verdon lake, Richardson county; Rock Creek lake, Dundy county; Shell lake, Cherry county; Walgren lake, Sheridan county; Wellfieet lake, Lincoln county; Goose lake, Holt county; Long lake, Brown county; Hord lake, Merrick county.

The following regulations are in effect on State-Owned lakes only:

- 1. FISHING DEVICES other than regular lines attached to poles are prohibited.
- 2. EACH PERSON is permitted to use not more than two poles with two hooks per line.
 - 3. THROW LINES OR FLOATS are prohibited.
- 4. DIGGING OR SEINING for bait on grounds is pro-
- 5. MOTOR BOATS are not permitted except on Victory lake at Fremont and Cottonmill lake at Kearney.
- 6. FIREARMS are not permitted except during legal open hunting season.
- 7. STATE LAKE NO. 4 of the Fremont sandpits located along state highway No. 30 about four miles west of Fremont in Sec. 13, T 17N, R 7E, Dodge county, shall be restricted to the use of artificial lures from January 1 to June 30, inclusive.
- 8. SMITH LAKE, Sheridan county; ATKINSON LAKE, Holt county, and HULL LAKE, Boyd county, shall be closed to fishing until July 1, 1952. These lakes shall then be open to fishing under regulations for "state-owned" lakes as listed above.

RESTRICTED AREAS

Restricted areas shall be designated on various lakes during the spawning season in which areas fishing shall not be permitted.

1. Medicine Creek reservoir and three miles upstream from the backwater, Frontier county, shall be closed to fishing until April 1, 1952. The lake and stream above shall be open to fishing on April 1, 1952.

2. Enders reservoir, and upstream to the Imperial Light Plant dam in Chase county, shall be closed to fishing and to the taking of bait until further change.

3. Swanson lake, Hitchcock county, and Harlan County reservoir in Harlan county, shall be closed

to fishing until further change.

- 4. The main channel of the Nemaha river and the Little Nemaha river and within one mile of the mouth of any of the tributaries running into said rivers in Richardson, Pawnee, Gage, Johnson, Nemaha, Otoe and Lancaster counties shall be closed to taking of bait at all times. Bait seining will be permitted in the tributaries one mile above the mouth of each tributary to the source.
- 5. The Cedar river and its tributaries in Holt, Garfield and Wheeler counties is closed to the taking of bait at all times.
- 6. Watts lake and Clear lake on the Valentine National Wildlife refuge in Cherry county is open to winter fishing from December 15 through February 28 of each year, and closed to fishing the balance of each year until further change by the U. S. Fish and Wildlife service.
- 7. It shall be illegal to seine for or otherwise take minnows or bait below any dam, check, spillway or other artificial obstruction and for a distance of 200 yards below such obstruction; provided, however, dip nets with an opening of not over 12 inches in diameter and having one-fourth inch mesh only of non-metallic material may be used by individuals for their own use, but no minnows or bait may be taken for commercial use.

The following streams are closed to the seining or taking of minnows or bait in any manner, and are closed to all fishing during the closed trout season.

ANTELOPE COUNTY—Verdigre creek and all tributaries, BANNER COUNTY—Pumpkin creek and all tributaries. BOX BUTTE COUNTY—Nubphara river, BROWN COUNTY—Long Pine creek; Plum creek and all tributaries; Calamus river; Goose creek.

CHASE COUNTY—Frenchman river from Enders lake to Imperial Light Plant lake.

CHERRY COUNTY—North Loup river and all tributaries; Schlagel creek; Fairfield creek; Cedar creeks; Snake river and all tributaries; Plum creek and all tributaries; Bear creek; Goose creek.

CHEYENNE COUNTY—Cedar creek.

CHEYENNE COUNTY—South Loup river above Arnold.

DAWES COUNTY—South Loup river above Arnold.

DAWES COUNTY—Chadron creek; Big Bordeaux creek; Little Bordeaux creek; Squaw creek; White river above Crawford; Niohrara river—excluding Box Butte reservoir—above Mirage Flats diversion dam at Old Dunlap and all tributaries; Dead Horse creek; Deep creek; White Clay creek; West Ash creek; Dead Man creek.

DUNDY COUNTY—Buffalo creek; Rock creek.

GARDEN COUNTY—Blue creek.

HOLT COUNTY—Blue creek.

HOLT COUNTY—Steel creek; North Branch of Verdigre; Middle Branch of Verdigre; South Branch of Verdigre; Brush creek; Red Bird creek; Eagle creek; Big Sandy creek.

LEGAL NETS, TRAPS AND OTHER DEVICES

The possession or use of any and all nets, traps or other devices is illegal with the following exceptions:

- 1. Commercial nets used in the Missouri river under special provisions of Section 37-502.
- 2. Minnow nets of non-metallic mesh, one-fourth inch square measure and not over 20 feet long and four feet deep.
- 3. Minnow dip nets of non-metallic mesh, one-fourth inch square measure and with a throat of not over 12 inches in diameter.
- 4. Landing nets used only for landing fish caught on hook and line, with a throat of 18 inches or less and non-metallic mesh of not less than one-inch square measure, and with a handle of not over four feet in length.
- 5. Minnow and bait traps with a length not to exceed 24 inches and a diameter of not to exceed 16 inches with an opening in the throat of the trap not larger than one and one-half inches in diameter. All minnow traps shall be raised and minnows removed from them at least once every 24 hours.

HOOKER COUNTY—Dismal river and all tributaries,
KEITH COUNTY—Otter creek; White Tail creek; Lonergin creek and tributaries.
KIMBALL COUNTY—Lodgepole creek and all tributaries—west of Owasco Irrigation canal dam located in Scc. 29, T 15, R 55W and approximately 100 feet cast of State Highway 29,
KNOX COUNTY—North, Middle and South Verdigre, and all tributaries above the town of Verdigre; Steel creek,
LINCOLN COUNTY—Hershey drains; No. 1 North Ditch,
No. 2 Middle Ditch, No. 3 South Ditch,
LOGAN COUNTY—South Loup river,
MORRILL COUNTY—Cedar creek; Red Willow drain;
Pumpkin creek and all tributaries; Plum creek; Wild Horse creek; Lyman drain; Miller drain; Myrtle Hill drain; North and South drain; Suhr drain; Silvernail drain.
ROCK COUNTY—Calamus river; Long Pine creek.
SCOTTS BLUFF COUNTY—Winter Creek drain; Nine Mile drain; Sheep Creek drains; Dry Sheep creek; Spotted Tail drains and all tributaries; Dry Spotted Tail drains and all tributaries; The Springs drains; Minatare drain; Stuckenhole (Leavitt's) drain; Aker's Draw.
SHERIDAN COUNTY—Sheep Creek; Little Bordeaux creek, SIOUX COUNTY—Sheep Creek; Little Bordeaux creek, SIOUX COUNTY—Sheep Creek drain; Dry Sheep Creek drain; Dry Spotted Tail drain; Niobrara river and all tributaries; White river and all tributaries; Monroe creek; Sow Belly creek; Hat creek; Dead Man creek; Deep creek; Sow Belly creek; Hat creek; Dead Man creek; Deep creek; Suaw creek.

THOMAS COUNTY—Elm creek.

CATFISH (Commercial Fishing)

Under proper commercial permit issued by the Commission, catfish may be taken from the Missouri river by nets, the meshes of which are not less than one and one-half inches square.

OPEN SEASON-Continuous.

AREA OPEN—Missouri river, south and west of the middle of the channel and not less than 300 yards in any direction from the mouth of any stream emptying into the river.

SIZE LIMIT-13 inches.

POSSESSION LIMIT-None.

POSSESSION LIMIT—None,
ANNUAL REPORT—All persons holding a commercial Seining-Vendor Permit shall keep an accurate record of the number, species and weight of all fish caught and a separate report of all fish sold during the calendar year. A record shall be kept for each month separately. Such records shall be open at all reasonable times to inspection by Commission agents. Each person shall send this information to the Secretary of the State Game, Forestation and Parks Commission on or before the 15th day of January of the following year. Forms for this purpose shall be furnished by the State. Failure to make such report shall be cause of refusal to issue a new permit.

COMMERCIAL NETS—It shall be illegal for any person holding a Seining-Vendor Permit to use or have in possession wing nets, dip nets, basket traps, gill nets, traps or any other device than regular hoop nets, trammel nets, seines or trot lines made of non-metallic cord as provided for by law.
