

General Regulations

NOTICE

CHANGES FOR 2004

Largemouth bass: Marina Lake located on E.T. Mahoney Park was changed from an 18-inch minimum length limit to total catch and release. Swan Creek Lake 5A, Yankee Hill Lake and York Recharge Lake now have a 21-inch minimum length limit while Bader Memorial Pits 1 - 7, Cornhusker WMA pond, Pawnee Prairie WMA, Sacramento-Wilcox WMA and Three R's Pond are total catch and release.

Striped bass hybrid: Bridgeport SRA, Fremont SRA, Fort Kearny SRA, Louisville SRA and Windmill SRA now have an 18-inch minimum length limit and a daily bag limit of one.

Channel and Blue catfish: Bader Memorial Pits 1 - 7, Cornhusker WMA Pond, Prairie View Lake Recreation Area, Sacramento- Wilcox WMA, Summit Lake and Three R's Pond now have a daily bag limit of three.

Cornhusker WMA pond, Crescent Lake National Wildlife Refuge, Frye Lake, Prairie View Lake Recreation Area, Sacramento-Wilcox WMA, Summit Lake, York Recharge Lake and Three R's Pond now have a daily bag limit of 10.

Bluegill: Yankee Hill Lake now has an 8-inch minimum length limit.

Paddlefish Archery and Snagging: Two applicants can submit a joint application, and it was established that 95% of paddlefish tags will be reserved for Nebraska resident anglers.

Paddlefish Snagging: The area closed to snagging has been reduced to include only that area below Gavins Point Dam downstream to a line that extends from the east end of the south cement wall of the discharge canal northwest to the east end of the chalk point. This does not open the north wall of the stilling basin for snagging.

may now purchase up to three tags and allowed up to 12 trout in possession. An adult angler is allowed to have two children under the age of 16 fish with them. The group bag limit is still limited to four trout per tag. Anglers are now allowed to use two fishing poles each.

Baitfish: Elwood Reservoir has been added to list of waterbodies that allow the use of cast nets for the collection of gizzard shad or alewife. No live baitfish may be used or possessed on Yankee Hill Lake.

Urban Fishing Areas: Four additional areas have been added to the Urban Fishing Program. They are: Barnett Park Pond (McCook), Henderson Park Lake, Johnson Park Pond (Fremont) and Weeping Water Pond. They are being managed with total catch and release on largemouth bass, panfish have a daily bag limit of 10 and channel catfish have a daily bag limit of three.

Any fish that is not to be counted in the bag limit must be returned immediately to the water with as little injury as possible. Any fish placed on a stringer or in a container, or not returned to the water must be counted in the bag. No culling or high-grading allowed.

Daily Bag: The daily bag limit is fish harvested from midnight to midnight. No person may possess more than one day's bag limit of fish while on the water or actively engaged in fishing.

Possession Limit: This is the total number of a species of fish that a person may have in possession in portable coolers, home freezers, registered in his name in a commercial cold storage locker or in any other way under their control. Fish or aquatic animals placed in public storage must be labeled with the owner's name, address, phone number, date of birth, signature, date taken, species and numbers and the name of recipient if they are transferred.

Length Limit: The defined size of a fish species that can be legally taken.


The proper method to obtain the length of a fish is to lay the fish on its side with its mouth closed and the tail lobes pressed together. With a yard stick or tape measure under the fish, measure the length from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail. (Do not follow the contour of the fish, it would over estimate the length of the fish)

Length Limits and Cleaning of Fish:
Where length and bag limits apply, fish cannot be filleted until fishing is completed for the day and off the water. Fish species subject to a bag limit and possession limit, but not a length limit, can be filleted prior to transport if the fillets are kept in one piece until cooked, so the bag and possession

limits can be determined. Fish species subject to a length limit cannot be possessed with more than the gills, viscera and scales removed while on the water, wading or engaged in fishing. Any fish in possession while actively fishing will be subject to length and bag limits that apply to the water being fished. Once off the water, the fish can be filleted for transportation and storage.

BULLFROGS

Bullfrog season runs Aug. 15 through Oct. 31. The bag limit is eight bullfrogs per person. They may be captured only by hand or by the use of a hand net or hook-and-line. Artificial light may be used when taking bullfrogs. Bullfrogs must measure 4½ inches from snout to vent or be released. Only the entrails may be removed prior to transport.

SNAPPING TURTLES

Snapping turtles may be taken year-round, and limits are 10 in the daily bag and 20 in possession. They may be taken only by hand, hand net, hookand-line, bow-and-arrow or gaff hook.

MUSSELS (CLAMS)

Mussels may be taken year-round by hand, hand net or hook-and-line. The limit is 10 daily and 20 in possession.




It is unlawful to use a gaff hook or other penetrating device while landing snagged paddlefish. Immediate cleaning of a snagged paddlefish is restricted to the removal of only the snout, in front of the eye, and the viscera. Final processing may only be completed once the angler has reached his residence or prior to consumption. Anglers should be prepared to transport a large paddlefish with only the snout removed, if they choose to harvest a fish more than 45 inches in length.



PADDLEFISH - ARCHERY Missouri River

Paddlefish may be taken by bow and arrow and possessed on open waters of the Missouri River only during the season that begins on the 2nd Saturday of July and runs for 16 consecutive days, with legal hours being sunrise to sunset. The area of the Missouri River open to archery paddlefish

NUBRACKA PADDITTOS TAPVITOT TAGO

The paddlefish is a limited and precious resource, and it is important that the harvest be closely regulated. A tag will be required for both archers and snaggers who want to harvest a paddlefish (see "Paddlefish Archery" pg 20 and "Paddlefish Snagging" pg. 19).

It is important to remember that one person can have no more than two tags for the archery season and two for the snagging season. These tags are non-transferable, they must be in possession while actively pursuing a paddlefish, and they must be immediately attached and locked shut to the dorsal fin of a harvested paddlefish. Archers will have a 16 consecutive day season, beginning on the **second saturday of July** and snaggers will have a 30-day season, **October 1-30**.



General Information

FISH SALVAGE IN IRRIGATION CANALS

The Nebraska Game and Parks Commission (NGPC) has implemented new regulations affecting fish salvage activities on dewatered irrigation canals. The major changes include a list of approved canals and a new application and reporting process.

The following list summarizes the new regulations for fish salvage of irrigation canals:

- Fish salvage is restricted to canals listed in the regulations.
- An application must be filled out, approved by NGPC, and carried by parties conducting fish salvage on canals.
- Stocking fish in any waterbody with fish salvaged from irrigation canals must be approved on the salvage application form.
- Salvaged sport fish taken for human consumption are restricted to all statewide length, daily bag, and possession limits.
- Salvaged baitfish must comply with bait collection regulations.
- All approved fish salvage from irrigation canals must be reported to NGPC on the report form provided.

On a river or stream, when can a person legally enter private property without the owner's permission? After properly accessing a flowing body of water, an angler can fish while afloat in a tube, canoe or boat. An angler or canoeist in an unpowered vessel can enter private property without permission, only if it's necessary to portage around a fence or obstruction. Landowner permission is required to operate vehicles, such as all-terrain vehicles, along or in a stream.



CATCH AND RELEASE WORKS

tew guidelines: using proper techniques, you give fish the best chance of survival. Here are a Catch-and-release fishing only works when the fish you release survive. By

- Wet hands and keep fish in water as much as possible when handling and removing the hook.
- Remove the hook gently. Do not squeeze the fish or put your fingers into the gills
- Barbless hooks reduce handling time and make it simpler to remove the hook, often by backing it from the fish's mouth without lifting the fish from the water.
- Release the fish only after its equilibrium is maintained. If necessary, hold fish gently upright until it can swim away.
- Do not play the fish to exhaustion.
- Removal of deeply imbedded hooks by use of a hemostat or hook removal presence can result in delayed mortality. released fish. Modern hooks require a longer time period to rust so their device is presently considered the best method to ensure higher survival of
