





NEW FOR 2015

The following new regulations are valid starting Jan. 1, 2015:

Trout – Daily bag limit at Soldier Creek Wilderness Area (Sioux County), including the Wood Reserve ponds and the middle and south fork of Soldier Creek, decreased to two.

Channel catfish – Daily bag limit increased from five to 10 on Gallagher Canyon, Jeffrey Reservoir, Johnson Lake, Lake Babcock, Lake Maloney, Lake North, Lewis and Clark Lake, Midway Canyon Reservoir, Phillips Canyon, Plum Creek Canyon Reservoir and Sutherland Reservoir. These bodies are part of canal or river system and sustain excellent self-recruiting channel catfish populations.

Walleye, Sauger and Saugeye – Daily bag limit may include one fish 15-18 inches and three more than 18 inches OR four more than 18 inches, with no more than one 22 inches or longer on the following additional water bodies: Big Indian 11A, Buffalo Creek Reservoir, Burchard Lake, Czechland Lake, Glenn Cunningham Lake, Holmes Lake, Iron Horse Trail Lake, Lake Wanahoo SRA, Lawrence Youngman Lake, Lone Star Recreation Area, Meadowlark Lake, Olive Creek Lake SRA, Pawnee Lake SRA, Prairie Queen Recreation Area, Red Cedar Lake, Skyview Lake, Stagecoach Lake SRA, Standing Bear Lake, Walnut Creek Reservoir, Wehrspann Lake Recreation Area, Wildwood Lake WMA, Willard Meyer Recreation Area, Yankee Hill Lake WMA and Zorinsky Lake Recreation Area. This is intended to limit premature harvest of advanced (9 inches) walleye and saugeye scheduled to be stocked into these water bodies while still allowing some harvest of smaller individuals.

Northern pike - Hershey I-80 Lake added to the list of water bodies with 30-inch minimum length limits.

Bowfin and American eel – The harvest of neither of these two species are allowed due to declining populations in Nebraska.

Mussels – No harvest allowed from any river or stream east of U.S. Hwy. 81 since these areas contain mussel species that are declining in abundance.

Bow and Arrow Fishing – Crossbows allowed statewide, EXCEPT in area from Gavins Point tailwater downstream to the U.S. Hwy. 81 bridge.

Two Rivers SRA trout lake – Cost of trout tag increased to \$6 to help cover production cost. Last increased in 1997.

No Live Baitfish Water Bodies – Bennington Lake, Bowman Lake, Independence Landing Lake, Kramper Lake, Prairie Queen Recreation Area and Rat and Beaver Lake were added to the list where it is illegal to possess or use live baitfish.

Aquatic Invasive Species – Added White River crayfish and Red Swamp crayfish to the Category 1 species list since they are showing up illegally in bait shops and are potential threat to native crayfish. Added Creeping Water Primrose to the Category 2 species list since it has limited distribution and has shown potential to have aggressive growth once established.

Boat Inspections – It is illegal to either arrive or leave any water body in Nebraska with water other than from a domestic source (water supply system, well or bottled) except for firefighting purposes. This regulation is intended to prevent or delay the establishment of aquatic invasive species, particularly zebra mussels, in Nebraska waters.

Fees - Issuing fees may apply to all fishing and park permits listed below EXCEPT veteran fish/hunt. senior fish/hunt, disabled, and deployed military permits.

Stamps - Aquatic Habitat Stamp included in price of all fishing permits listed below EXCEPT the following that do not require one: paddlefish, veteran fish/hunt, senior fish/hunt, and disabled permits.

PERMITS

It is important for anglers to buy a fishing permit to support Nebraska fisheries management, habitat protection and restoration programs. A Nebraska permit is required of residents and nonresidents age 16 and over. Nonresidents under age 16 need not have a fishing permit if they are accompanied by someone who has a Nebraska fishing permit.

WHO NEEDS A FISHING PERMIT?

A fishing permit is required to take, or attempt to take, fish, bullfrogs, snapping turtles, barred salamanders (formerly tiger salamanders), or mussels by any legal method. An angler must carry the fishing permit while actively fishing.

Residents - The requirements to qualify as a Nebraska resident:

- Reside in Nebraska continuously for 30 days or more before making application for a permit and intend to become a resident of Nebraska.
- Residents attending school in another state, or stationed outside the state of Nebraska as part of a military assignment, who have maintained Nebraska as their state of legal residency.
- Military personnel and full-time students stationed or attending school in Nebraska for a period of at least 30 days.

NOTE: A new resident should be prepared to provide documentation of residency (driver's license, voter registration, etc.) to an officer when in possession of a resident permit.

Nonresidents - A nonresident fishing permit is required of all people who are not Nebraska residents, except those listed above and those under 16 years of age who are accompanied by someone with a Nebraska fishing permit.

WHEN FISHING PERMIT IS NOT REQUIRED

Owners or their guests fishing on a private water body are not required to have a fishing permit if all of the following apply to that body of water: 1) is located entirely on privately owned land, 2) is entirely privately stocked, 3) does not connect by inflow or outflow with any other water outside such land, and 4) is not operated on a commercial basis for profit. In addition, any licensed commercial put-and-take operation is exempt from a fishing permit.

OTHER TYPES OF PERMITS

Fee-Exempt Permits - These are available to resident veterans who:

- are 50 percent disabled as a result of armed forces service
- receive a pension from the Veterans Administration as a result of a total and permanent disability not incurred in the line of duty while in military service
- obtained fee-exempt permits before Jan. 1, 2006

Veteran and Senior Permits - An annual fish/hunt permit is available for resident veterans age 64 and older and residents age 69 and older.

Special Fishing Permit - This annual permit is for physically or developmentally disabled residents who cannot cast or retrieve unassisted.

- This entitles the disabled person and one person assisting him or her to take, fish, catch, harvest, or possess any aquatic organism in compliance with state regulations.
- If the person assisting does not have a valid fishing permit, they are restricted to one daily bag limit between the two anglers.
- Disabled person is a person certified by a physician to have a permanent physical impairment or

developmental disability that results in the inability to use fishing equipment unassisted.

· Applications are available from Game and Parks district offices, as well as offices in Omaha and the Ak-Sar-Ben Aquarium.

Educational Fishing Project Permit - This may be obtained by instructors at any university, college, or high school from the Fisheries Division for his/her students, 16 years of age and older who are participating in an educational fishing project.

Paddlefish Permit - Required, along with a Nebraska fishing permit, for taking paddlefish by snagging or bow and arrow.

Salvage Permit - The permit allows for the salvage of fish from selected irrigation canals located in the Platte River, Republican River and Loup River drainages. Applications must be submitted to Game and Parks' North Platte district office and the Kearney service center.


MOBILE PERMITS AVAILABLE FOR FISHING

Nebraska fishing permits may be purchased, accessed or displayed on a mobile device. The image of a mobile permit may be displayed and saved on a device such as a phone or tablet.



BORDER WATERS

Anglers holding a Nebraska, South Dakota, Iowa, or Missouri sport fishing license may fish all waters of the Missouri River in the state they are licensed, as well as Missouri River waters of the state immediately across the river.

- · Missouri River waters are defined to include all flowing portions and backwaters, sloughs and chutes that draw water from the Missouri River.
- · Oxbows and backwaters separated from the Missouri River by land are included if the state boundary line passes through some part of such waters.
- Mouths of tributaries may be fished only in the state that the angler is licensed.
- · Anglers may fish from either bank or boats. NOTE: Archery and spearfishing are not allowed.
- · Anglers fishing in the state for which they do not hold a fishing permit must abide by the more restrictive of the two state's regulations.
- · Iowa and Missouri resident anglers may fish waters of Hamburg Bend Wildlife Management Area and the Nebraska portion of the Missouri River from the chute entrance (adjacent to Iowa) to the chute exit (adjacent to Missouri).

HOOK-AND-LINE REGULATIONS

Hook-and-line fishing is allowed year-round throughout the state, except as noted or as posted at an


Definition of a Hook - One hook means a single, double or treble-pointed hook. All hooks attached to an artificial bait or lure shall be counted as one hook.

Ponds, Lakes or Reservoirs - Anglers are limited to no more than two lines, with a maximum of two hooks on each line, with these being any type of attached line (such as rod and reel or fishing pole) on all lakes, ponds or reservoirs or in their inlets, outlets and canals within one-half mile of these bodies of water, with the exception of ice-fishing line limits. This includes Lewis and Clark Lake from Gavins Point Dam upstream to the Santee boat ramp in Knox County.

Ice-Fishing - A total of five lines with two hooks on each line are permitted. Each line must be under direct supervision and within unaided observation of the angler. Holes made for ice-fishing may not exceed 10 inches in diameter on any area controlled by Game and Parks, A special \$5 permit is required for a permanent shelter on state recreation areas and wildlife management area lakes. Applications and regulations are available from conservation officers or Game and Parks offices. This does not apply to temporary shelters used and removed each day.

Rivers or Streams - A total of 15 hooks are allowed, ranging from 15 lines each with a single hook attached, to three lines with a maximum of five hooks attached. These hook-and-line limits apply to anglers who must be one-half mile from any lake, pond or reservoir that is associated with that river or stream. These can be rods and reels, poles, bank lines, or setlines that are attached to the bank and not free-floating. Jug lines are illegal and defined as any line not attached to the shoreline or a pole. All bank lines and setlines must contain the angler's name, address and fishing-permit number or driver's license number.

NOTE: Upon completion of fishing, all bank lines and setlines must be removed.



IT IS UNLAWFUL TO ...

- borrow or use the permit of another or lend your permit to another
- leave dead fish or any part of one on the banks or in the water of any stream, lake or other body of
- fish on any private land without landowner permission
- release into public waters of the state any fish that did not originate from that body of water. NOTE: Dumping of bait buckets not allowed.
- seine sport fish of any size
- leave fish in a trap for more than 24 hours
- attempt to snag fish, except in designated areas (see page 26)
- · use limb lines or set lines in any pond, lake or reservoir
- · catch fish by hand
- buy or attempt to buy a permit while under license suspension or revocation in any state
- · keep an externally foul-hooked fish, except those legally snagged
- consume and/or have an open container of alcohol at Lake McConaughy State Recreation Area or at any posted wildlife management area

SNAGGING

Snagging of paddlefish and nongame fish is permitted only in the Missouri River under season dates and limits specified in the Paddlefish and Snagging of Nongame Fish section. All other state waters are closed to snagging for all species at all times. All fish snagged accidentally or otherwise foulhooked, must be returned to the water immediately.

BAG, POSSESSION AND LENGTH LIMITS

Bag and possession limits may vary between "inland waters" and "waters of the Missouri River." For this purpose only:

- "inland waters" include all waters of the state except the waters of the Missouri River
- · "waters of the Missouri River" include all of the river along Nebraska's border and all reservoirs, oxbows, sloughs, chutes, backwaters, and marshes that have annual surface water connection to the river and the first 300 yards upstream from the mouth of all tributary streams
- · "statewide" includes all inland waters of the state and waters of the Missouri River

Culling - Any fish that is not to be counted in the daily bag limit must be returned immediately to the water with as little injury as possible. Any fish placed on a stringer or in a container, or not returned to the water must be counted in the bag. Culling and highgrading is not allowed.

Daily Bag Limit - The number of fish harvested from midnight to the following midnight taken by all legal methods combined. No person may possess more than one day's bag limit of fish while on the water or actively fishing.

Possession Limit - The total number of fish that a person may possess in portable coolers, home freezers, registered in his/her name in a commercial cold storage locker, or in any way under their control. Fish or aquatic animals placed in public storage or transferred must be labeled with the owner's name, address, phone number, date of birth, signature, date taken, species and numbers, and the name of recipient, if transferred.

How to Measure a Fish - Lay the fish on its side with its mouth closed and the tail lobes pressed together. With a yardstick or tape measure under the fish, measure the length from the tip of the snout to the end of the tail. Do not follow the contour of the fish.

Minimum Length Limit - A fish must be equal to or longer than the defined length to be legally harvested.

Maximum Length Limit - A fish must be shorter than the defined length to be legally harvested.

Protected Slot Limit - A range of lengths of a particular species that may not be harvested legally. For instance, a 28- to 34-inch protected slot limit on northern pike means that only northern pike less than 28 inches in length or greater than 34 inches may be harvested.

One-Over Length Bag Limits - For some species, such as black bass and walleye, the number of large fish that may be harvested may be limited on some or all waters. For example, while it may be legal to harvest four black bass more than 15 inches from a given lake, statewide regulations prohibit an angler from harvesting more than one black bass 21 inches or longer each day from any waters. Therefore, for lakes with a 21-inch minimum length limit on black bass, the daily bag limit becomes one fish.

LENGTH LIMITS AND CLEANING OF FISH

Where length and bag limits apply, fish may not be filleted until fishing is completed for the day and anglers are off the water. Fish subject to bag and possession limits but not length limits, may be processed before transport if the fillets are kept in one piece until cooked, so the bag and possession limits can be determined.

Fish species subject to a length limit may not be possessed with more than the gills, viscera and scales removed while on the water, wading or engaged in fishing. Any fish in possession while actively fishing or on the water will be subject to length and bag limits that apply to the water being fished. Once off the water, the fish may be filleted for transportation and storage.

BAIT REGULATIONS

Baitfish, listed amphibians and crayfish may not be sold, except by permit. For commercial purposes (bait dealers, private aquaculturists and nonresident fish dealers), refer to the regulations supplied with your permit. The following regulations apply only to bait obtained for personal use.

- · It is unlawful to take baitfish, listed amphibians or crayfish from any public lake, reservoir or bayou unless otherwise stated below.
- · Digging and trapping for bait or any other purpose is prohibited on all state-owned or controlled
- It shall be unlawful for any individual or bait dealer to transport away from the river any live fish to be used for bait which has been collected on the Missouri River downstream below Gavins Point Dam to the Kansas border and all other rivers and streams located east of U. S. Hwy. 81 from the South Dakota border to York, north of Interstate 80 from York to Lincoln, and east of U. S. Hwy. 77 from Lincoln to the Kansas border. The use of baitfish seined by anglers from these rivers and streams may only be used at the body of water from which they were captured.

- Seining for baitfish, listed amphibians or crayfish is allowed on streams located on state recreation areas (SRA) and wildlife management areas (WMA) unless the stream is listed as closed.
- All non-baitfish taken while netting or seining for bait must be returned immediately to the waters from which taken.
- The bag and possession limit of baitfish and listed amphibians for personal use is 100.

NOTE: Anglers who seine their own baitfish must properly identify the fish species collected to avoid transfer of invasive species (see page 30). It is illegal to dump baitfish or water from the seining location into a different water body as that could also transfer invasive species including fish diseases.

Gizzard Shad and Alewife – May be taken for use as bait by legal dip nets from lakes, ponds, reservoirs, and below dams and other artificial obstructions for a distance of 200 yards below such obstructions.

- Live shad and alewife may be used only in the body of water from which they were captured.
- Shad and alewife may be taken by legal seine or dip net in streams, except those streams closed to the taking of baitfish or bait by such method, but can't be transferred alive and used in other waters.

Below Dams – The seining of baitfish, listed amphibians or crayfish is unlawful for a distance of 200 yards below any dam or spillway. In these waters, baitfish, listed amphibians and crayfish may be taken by legal baitfish dip nets for personal use only.

Restricted Species – It is unlawful to sell, transport or offer for sale as bait, any live carp, carpsucker, bullhead, buffalo, gar, quillback, gizzard shad or alewife.

- Live fish of those species may be used for bait only in the same waters from which they are legally taken.
- Dead carp, carpsucker, bullhead, buffalo, gar, quillback, gizzard shad or alewife may be transported for use as bait.

Sport fish may be used for bait if:

- they have been acquired legally from a licensed aquaculturist or a nonresident fish dealer. The angler must keep a legible receipt or invoice from the dealer listing the date, seller's name and address, and number and size of each species sold.
- they are captured using hook and line and used at the body of water from which they were captured. Anglers must follow both the length and bag limits for that body of water.

Importation – It is unlawful for individuals to import live baitfish from out of state for use in inland waters. This does not include the Missouri River. It is unlawful to import or transport carp, carpsucker, buffalo, quillback, gar, gizzard shad or alewife into the state for use as bait. Special permits are required for a person to import and sell bait or baitfish.

OTHER BAIT RESTRICTIONS

White Perch — It is illegal to transport or possess live white perch away from the body of water from which they were caught. The introduction of white perch into new bodies of water may destroy the quality of the fish community and may require the total renovation of the fishery.

Dumping – It is illegal to release baitfish or any fish caught from a different body of water into public waters.

Exportation – Up to 100 legally captured baitfish and/or listed amphibians may be exported by a resident for personal use for fishing outside the state if allowed by the destination state. Licensed aquaculturists may transport an unlimited number of baitfish that have been artificially propagated in manmade impoundments out of state if allowed by the destination state.

Baits and Scents – Cutbait is legal if the fish used has been legally acquired and the size, bag and possession limits for that species and body of water have been followed. It also is legal to chum for fish using nonharmful baits. Anise oil and other scents that do not stun, kill or harm fish are permitted.

Leopard Frogs and Barred (formerly tiger) Salamanders – All regulations that cover the legal use of baitfish also apply to these species. Leopard frogs can only be collected for individual use, not commercial use.

Crayfish – There is no possession limit on crayfish. Anyone over the age of 16 must have a bait dealer's license in order to sell crayfish. Crayfish may be captured by hook and line, by hand or by legal fish nets and traps as described below. No permit is needed to collect for personal use.

Fish Nets and Traps – The possession or use of nets, traps and electrical gear capable of stunning fish is prohibited except for the following:

- Baitfish seines of one-fourth inch nonmetallic square mesh only and not more than 20 feet long and four feet deep.
- Baitfish dip nets of one-fourth inch, nonmetallic square mesh. Neither length nor width may exceed 36 inches.
- Baitfish and bait traps of one-fourth inch square mesh material with a length of 24 inches or less, a diameter of 16 inches or less and a throat 2 ¼ inches or less in diameter. All minnow traps shall be raised, and the baitfish removed at least every 24 hours.
- Landing nets, made of nonmetallic mesh, used only for landing fish caught on hook-and-line.

Turtle Traps - A legal turtle trap must contain a throat or funnel to be constructed of netting that is at least 4 inches square mesh. The trap must have an entrance possible only from above the water's surface and must allow turtles to reach the surface to breathe. The trap must be personally checked at least every 24 hours and tagged with a metal tag listing the owner's name, address, and fishing permit number or driver's license number. Turtle traps can only be used on private waters and it is unlawful to sell, offer for sale or barter any snapping turtles. Any turtle(s) exceeding the daily bag limits shall be released immediately.

CAST NETS

- Only cast nets up to 10 feet in diameter with a mesh size no larger than three-eighths inches square measure are legal gear.
- Cast nets may be used only during July, August, September, October and November.
- · Cast nets may be used to collect gizzard shad and alewife only.
- · Live gizzard shad and alewife may only be used for bait the same day they were captured and only in the same body of water where they were collected.

FISH STOCKING

It is unlawful to release any non-native fish, reptile or amphibian in waters of the state or to release any fish in any public waters in the state except in those waters from which it came, without written authorization from the Nebraska Game and Parks Commission.


ARCHERY AND SURFACE SPEARFISHING

- Game fish may be taken by archery statewide from July 1 through Dec. 31 from sunrise to sunset.
- Game fish may not be taken with surface spears.
- Nongame fish may be taken by archery or surface spear statewide 24 hours a day year around.
- Artificial lights are allowed.
- · Only hand-drawn longbows (including compound bows) and crossbows are legal.
- · Arrows may have only one point, which must be barbed, and must be attached by a line to the bow at the time the arrow is released.
- · For surface spearing, only hand spears are legal.
- The following waters are closed year-round: Platte River State Park and Eugene T. Mahoney State Park.

NOTE: Game and Parks does not control the closure of public bodies of water that are controlled by other entities, such as cities, counties and natural resources districts.

UNDERWATER SPEARFISHING

· Lawful spear guns include hand spears, rubber band-powered spear guns, compressed air spear guns, and spring-loaded spear guns.

- All spears used on powered spear guns must be attached to a shooting line no more than 20 feet
- Underwater spearfishing is not permitted within 100 yards of any designated swimming or waterski jump area, boat dock, boat ramp, or spillway.

Seasons - The season for game fish is July 1 through Dec. 31 in waters listed below, except *Box Butte Reservoir and private waters, which starts on June 1. Bag, possession and length limits are the same as for hook and line. Hours are sunrise to sunset. The season for nongame fish is year-round in waters listed below. There are no size, bag or possession limits for nongame fish species. Hours are sunrise to sunset.

Diver's Flag - A diver's flag must be displayed on the water on a float or buoy when diving or underwater spearfishing. Divers and underwater spearfishers must remain within 150 feet of the flag. The flag must be at least 12 inches square, with a red background and white diagonal stripe that is one-fifth the width of the flag. The white stripe must run from the top of the hoist to the bottom of the flag. It is unlawful to display this flag when diving or spearfishing is not in progress.

TROUT WATERS

NOTE: All application periods begin at 1 p. m. Central Time. Mailed applications must be received in the Lincoln office by 5 p.m. on the last day of the application period. Online applications end at midnight.

ARCHERY PADDLEFISH


Paddlefish may be taken by bow and arrow and possessed in a designated area of the Missouri River only during the season.

Season - 30 days, beginning on second Saturday in July

Legal Hours - sunrise to sunset

Open Area – The open area is from Gavins Point Dam downstream to the mouth of the Big Sioux River at mile marker 734.

Closed Area – The area extending downstream from Gavins Point Dam to a line extending from the east end of the south cement wall of the discharge channel northwest to the east end of the north wall of the spillway is closed to archers. The area downstream of this line is open to archers taking game and nongame fish during the appropriate seasons. The use of crossbows is not allowed in the area from the Gavins Point tailwaters downstream to the U.S. Hwy. 81 bridge.



NOTE: If the spillway gates are in operation, boating may be restricted in the tailwater area by the U.S. Corps of Engineers.

NOTE: From the open area below Gavins Point Dam to 0.6 miles downstream, archers may harvest paddlefish if they possess a valid Nebraska resident or Nebraska nonresident archery paddlefish permit or a South Dakota resident archery paddlefish permit. In the remainder of the river open to archery paddlefish, South Dakota nonresident archery paddlefish permits also are valid. The area downstream of this line is open to archers taking game and nongame fish during the appropriate seasons.

Requirements – All paddlefish archery anglers must have in their possession a paddlefish tag and a Nebraska fishing permit, if required (see Permit Section, page 8). Applicants for tags must be 12 years old by the second Saturday of July.

Tagging – Any paddlefish landed must be tagged immediately in the dorsal fin with the angler's tag. Any paddlefish tag that is locked shut before attachment, altered or modified shall be void and will not be replaced.

Tag limit - Each angler may have no more than two tags.

Cleaning and Transportation – Anglers harvesting a paddlefish are allowed to process the fish down to two whole fillets after completion of a fishing trip and upon leaving the Missouri River with both the closed paddlefish tag and paddlefish permit remaining with the fillets.

SNAGGING PADDLEFISH


Snagging of paddlefish and nongame fish in the Missouri River is permitted from the Gavins Point Dam downstream to the mouth of the Big Sioux River at mile marker 734.

Season - Oct. 1-31

Area Closed – The area extending downstream from Gavins Point Dam to a line extending from the east end of the south cement wall of the discharge channel northwest to the east end of the chalk point is closed to snagging.

Also:

- Snagging off the north wall of the spillway is prohibited.
- · All inland waters are closed to paddlefish harvest.



NOTE: If the spillway gates are in operation, boating may be restricted in the tailwater area by the U.S. Corps of Engineers.

Requirements – Snaggers must have in their possession an unfilled paddlefish tag while actively snagging, in addition to a valid fishing permit, if required (see Permit Section on page xx). From Gavins Point Dam to 0.6 miles downstream, snaggers must possess a valid Nebraska resident or Nebraska nonresident snagging permit or a South Dakota resident snagging permit. In the remainder of the river open to snagging, South Dakota nonresident permits also are valid.

Possession – Paddlefish harvested by snagging may be possessed only on the Missouri River during the open season in the designated open area.

Legal Hours - 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Minimum Age – Applicants must be 12 years old by Oct. 1 to be eligible to apply for a snagging permit.

Tagging – A paddlefish must be tagged immediately in the dorsal fin with the angler's tag upon addition to the creel. Any paddlefish tag that is locked before attachment, altered or modified shall be void and will not be replaced.

Hooks – Only one hook may be used when snagging, and the gap between the point of the hook and the shank may not exceed one-half inch.

Bag and Possession Limits – The daily bag and possession limits are the total number of tags issued to an individual.

Casting and Hooking - All paddlefish anglers are required to cast for and hook their own fish.

Length Limit – All paddlefish between 35 and 45 inches long (measured along the centerline of the fish, lying flat, from the front margin of the eye to the natural fork of the tail), must be returned to the water immediately.

Gaff Hook – It is unlawful to use a gaff hook or other penetrating device while landing snagged paddlefish.

Cleaning and Transportation – Anglers harvesting a paddlefish are allowed to process the fish down to two whole fillets after completion of the fishing trip and upon leaving the Missouri River with both the closed paddlefish tag and paddlefish permit remaining with the fillets.

OTHER INFORMATION

ATVS AND SNOWMOBILES FOR ICE-FISHING

Snowmobiles, all-terrain and motorized off-highway amphibious vehicles may be operated on the frozen surface of designated lakes. These vehicles may be operated only from one-half hour before sunrise until 9 p.m., or as posted. Recommended ice thickness for vehicle use is eight inches. FREE FISHING AND PARK ENTRY DAY

Free Fishing and Park Entry Day is May 16, 2015. It is intended to attract those who no longer fish or who have never fished with an opportunity to do so without purchasing a permit. It is the Saturday before Memorial Day weekend. All bag and length limits are still in effect.

FAMILY FISHING EVENTS

The Nebraska Game and Parks Youth Fishing Program sponsors Family Fishing Events at community and recreation area lakes across the state. This is an opportunity for people who have never fished, or have not fished in years, to learn or refresh their skills. Fishing instruction, rods and reels, as well as bait are available for loan to participants free of charge. Appropriate fishing and parks permits are required. FISH KILL REPORTS

To make it easier to determine the cause, promptly report dead or dying fish to a conservation officer, Nebraska Game and Parks Commission district office, or the 24-hour Nebraska State Patrol pollution complaint number at 402-471-4545.

TOURNAMENTS, CONTESTS AND DERBIES

Registration - All fishing tournaments, derbies or contests that require an entry fee, on publicly owned, controlled or managed waters, must be registered with Game and Parks' Fisheries Division at least 45 days before the event. Download a registration form at OutdoorNebraska.org.

Denial - An event may be denied if the date and location conflict with a previously approved event. Denial also may be based on safety concerns due to low water or anticipated heavy use that could result in boat ramp congestion.

Special Conditions - Game and Parks may impose special conditions for a fishing tournament, derby or contest if deemed necessary to protect the resource or to assure public safety. Special conditions may include aerated livewells, release of live fish, designated release areas, on-the-water measurements, and immediate release of fish with no on-shore weigh-in ceremony.

Certificate - A Fishing Tournament Approval Certificate must be present at the tournament site.

Posted Dates - The tournament dates will be listed at OutdoorNebraska.org.

Results - A results form will be sent to the tournament director. This form must be completed and returned to the Fisheries Division within 30 days following the completion of the fishing tournament, Failure to return the completed form or provide the requested information will result in denial of future fishing-tournament requests for at least one year.

Tagged Fish - The use of tagged or otherwise marked fish is prohibited in any fishing tournament, derby or contest held on waters owned or controlled and stocked by Game and Parks during the preceding 24 months, excluding private lakes not owned by the state or other governmental entity.

AQUATIC NUISANCE SPECIES PREVENTION

Definition of Aquatic Nuisance Species – Any waterborne, non-native organism that threatens the diversity or abundance of native species, the ecological stability of impacted waters, or threatens a commercial, agricultural, aquacultural or recreational activity.

Impact – Nuisance species may cause significant ecological problems because they have been introduced into habitat in which there are no natural pathogens, parasites or predators. Lack of these natural controls in new habitat may allow a nuisance species to grow exponentially. Introduced nuisance species may prey upon or compete directly with native species and could transmit diseases to native species.

NEW FOR 2015

It is unlawful to arrive at or leave any water body in Nebraska with water other than from a domestic source (such as water supply system, well or bottled), except for fire-fighting purposes. This applies especially to boats, their compartments, equipment or containers that may hold water. Before leaving a waterbody, drain water on site.

Preventive Steps - Anglers and boaters

must take precautions to prevent the introduction or spread of nuisance species. This is especially important to boaters who travel to waters that have nuisance species not present in any Nebraska waters.

Follow these procedures:

- It is unlawful for a conveyance (boat or trailer) to leave a launch area with any aquatic vegetation from that water body still attached.
- Wash mud and vegetation off waders. Felt-sole wading boots are not allowed. Felt soles can stay damp for some time after wading and have been implicated in the spread of some aquatic nuisance species.
- Zebra and quagga mussels can survive up to two weeks out of water, so after boating in infested water and before launching your boat in a different waterbody, rinse boat and all equipment with hot tap water (more than 140 degrees F); spray boat and trailer with a high-pressure sprayer or dry boat and all equipment for at least five days. Vinegar can also be used to kill young zebra mussels.
- · Run the water out of the lower unit.
- · Clean, drain and dry your equipment.
- Game and Parks staff inspection of boats, trailers and all boating and fishing equipment may be required.

STATE RECORDS AND MASTER ANGLER AWARDS

If you make an outstanding catch, it may qualify for either a Nebraska Game and Parks Commission State Record or a Master Angler Award.

STATE RECORD RULES

- Fish must be caught in accordance with Nebraska fishing regulations by rod and reel, underwater spearfishing, surface spearing, or archery and must be taken from Nebraska waters.
- Fish must be weighed on an accredited or certified scale. A commercial measuring tape or stick should be used to measure the fish.
- Only fish that exceed the current record by at least one ounce are eligible for a state record.
- Two witnesses, one of which must be a permanent employee of Game and Parks, must witness the weighing and measuring of the fish and sign the application.
- The angler must display a Nebraska fishing permit to the Game and Parks employee that witnesses the weight.
- One clear photograph showing a close-up side view of the fish and one clear photograph showing the angler with the fish must accompany the completed application. All photographs become the property of the Game and Parks.
- A Game and Parks fisheries biologist must verify the species of fish, and the fish must be preserved flat until the species is verified.
- Game and Parks may collect fish scales, tissue or spine samples to check fish identification and to refuse any questionable application.
- Game and Parks may revoke a state record if the record holder is found in possession of illegal fishing gear or has been cited for repeated fishing violations that cast suspicion on the authenticity of the record catch.
- No fish caught from any aquaculture or commercial put-and-take facility is eligible.
- Applications must be submitted within 30 days of the date the fish was caught.

MASTER ANGLER RULES

- · All fish must be taken from Nebraska waters.
- If a fish is caught from private waters, a valid fishing permit is required to receive the award.
- Fish must be taken by hook-and-line, not bank lines or set lines.
- Fish must be legally hooked, played and landed by the applicant.
- $\bullet\,$ The catch must be verified by a Game and Parks employee, a permit vendor, a witness, or a photograph.

- Anglers 16 years of age or older must possess a valid Nebraska fishing permit and enter the permit number on the application.
- Only fish immediately released are eligible for an award based on length. Any fish kept in a livewell or on a stringer must meet the minimum weight requirement.
- Anglers may receive only one award based on weight per year for each species. Catch-and-release awards are unlimited.
- Anglers who release a Master Angler fish will receive a Catch and Release Master Angler pin in addition to the Master Angler certificate.

PUBLIC FISHING AREAS

These are areas open to the public to fish, except for private sections of rivers and streams, which require anglers to obtain landowner permission. Public areas include Nebraska Game and Parks Commission-owned or leased state recreation areas (SRA, NGPC park permit required), wildlife management areas (WMA), as well as federal, Corp of Engineers, Bureau of Reclamation, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS), power and irrigation, cities and leased private waters.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Lakes, rivers and streams are listed alphabetically within each of the following fisheries management districts: northwest, northeast, southwest and southeast.

FAMILY FRIENDLY LAKES (FFL)

The areas denoted with FFL are designated at Family Friendly Lakes. These lakes identified as being safe, comfortable and having great fish-catching potential. These locations have a combination of barrier-free fishing piers, fishing trails, groomed park areas, concessions, playgrounds, picnic areas, and highly maintained fish populations. Contact the nearest fisheries supervisor for details.



Alliance City Golf Course Pond (Box Butte) - 0.5 acres, 1E of Alliance. BLG, CUT, LMB, RBT, ROB. City ordinance allows public access from sunrise-9 a.m. Monday through Friday.



FFL Bessey Fish Pond (Thomas) - 3 acres, 1W, 1/4S of Halsey at Nebraska National Forest. BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT.


Camping. No motorized boating. Fishing deck. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally.

Big Alkali WMA (Cherry) - 842 acres, 16S, 4W, 1½ S of Valentine. BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB, NOP, YEP. All boats allowed. Boat ramp, camping and fishing camp. Snowmobiles and ATVs allowed on ice.

Big Springs City Pond (Deuel) - 0.5 acres, N end of Elm Street. BLG, CCF, LMB. Largemouth bass -21-inch minimum length limit.

Blue Creek (Garden) - NW of Lewellen. BNT, CUT. Private access, permission required.

Blue Lake (Garden) - 311 acres, 22N of Oshkosh. BLG, CRP, LMB, SMB, YEP. Access via primitive 2.7mile access trail on private property (no snow removal), open daylight hours only; no camping, hunting, ATVs, horses, fires, or littering; only four-wheel drive vehicles allowed. Area closed to access during the nine-day regular firearm deer season. Access to lake made possible through lease agreement with private landowner, so please follow the rules. Close all gates. Trespassers off



marked trail and parking lot will be prosecuted. Small boats recommended. Primitive boat launch. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Trail and lake may be closed seasonally due to wet or very dry conditions. For questions or conditions, call 308-763-2940.

Boardman Creek (Cherry) - 35SW of Valentine. BNT, RBT. Private access, permission required.

Bordeaux Creek (Dawes) - SE of Chadron. BKT, BNT. Public access on Big Bordeaux Creek WMA and U.S. Forest Service lands.

Box Butte Reservoir SRA (Dawes) - 1,600 acres, 10N of Hemingford. BCF, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, NOP, ROB, SMB, WAE, YEP. Northern pike - protected slot limit of 28 to 34 inches, daily bag limit of 10, only one of which may be more than 34 inches, possession limit of 20. Subject to severe summer drawdown. Primitive camping and electrical hook-ups. All boats allowed. Underwater spearfishing for gamefish starts June 1.

FFL Bridgeport SRA (Morrill) - 78 acres in five lakes, NW edge of Bridgeport. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, RBT, WAE, WIP, YEP. Primitive camping. All boats allowed on middle pit; other pits restricted to electric motor and non-powered boats. Rainbow trout stocked in NW lake. Wipers stocked in middle lake.

38 | Public Fishing Areas — Northwest

FFL Carter P. Johnson Lake (Sioux) - 15 acres, Fort Robinson SP. Cabins and camping. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, RBT, ROB. Electric motor and non-powered boats allowed. Wheelchair-accessible pier.

FFL Chadron City Reservoirs (Dawes) - 20 acres in two ponds, 5½S of Chadron. BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT, YEP. Non-powered boats allowed.

Chadron Creek (Dawes) - S of Chadron. BKT, BNT. Public access at Chadron SP, otherwise private access, permission required.

FFL Chadron State Park Pond (Dawes) - 2 acres, 9S of Chadron. RBT. No motorboats. Wheelchairaccessible deck, cabins and camping. Lake rehabilitation project in 2014-2015.

Redtail WMA (Butler) - 17 acres, 1E, ½N of Dwight. BLG, CCF, LMB. Walk-in access only. Electric motor or non-powered boats allowed.

Riverview Marina SRA (Missouri River) (Otoe) - Nebraska City, N. 4th Street and 14th Avenue. BCF, BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, FRD, GOE, SNS. Concrete boat ramp. Primitive camping.

Rockford Lake SRA (Gage) - 150 acres, 7E, 2S of Beatrice. BBH, BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, FCF, LMB, WAE, WHP. All boats allowed. Concrete boat ramp. Primitive and modern camping.

Rulo Access (Missouri River) (Richardson) - South of U.S. Hwy. 159 bridge near Rulo. BBH, BCF, BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, FRD, GOE, SNS. Concrete boat ramp.

Schilling WMA (Missouri and Platte Rivers) (Cass) - Plattsmouth - N on Schilling Road from Main Street. BCF, BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, FRD, GOE, SNS. Bank access to Missouri and Platte rivers, except when closed by Game and Parks due to poor road conditions.



Schwer Park Pond (Sarpy) - 2 acres, Papillion - W Centennial Road west of 84th Street. BLG, CCF, LMB. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit.

Shadow Lake (Sarpy) - 30 acres, Papillion - Washington and Capehart Rd. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB. Largemouth Bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake).

Shady Trail (Big Blue River) (Saline) - 1W, 4N, 1/2W, 1/2N of Crete. CAP, CCF, FCF.

Smith Creek (Seward) - 21 acres, 2N, 2W, ¼N of Beaver Crossing. BLG, CCF, LMB. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Owned by Upper Big Blue NRD. Turbid.

Stagecoach Lake SRA (Lancaster) - 195 acres, 14/S, 1/2W of Hickman. BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB, SAE, WAE, WIP. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Wiper - daily bag limit of three, with no more than one fish 16 inches or greater. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. Primitive and modern camping. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Wheelchair-accessible fishing pier.

Standing Bear Lake (Douglas) - 135 acres, Omaha - 132nd and Military. BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, FRD, LMB, RBT, WAE, YEB. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). City of Omaha lake. Concrete boat ramp. Open 5 a.m.-11 p.m. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally.

Stanton Lake (Richardson) - 2 acres, NW Falls City, W end of W. 25th Street. BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Modern campground. Picnic shelter and restrooms. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally.

Steinhart Park Ponds (Otoe) - 5 acres in two ponds, Nebraska City - N of Neb. Business Hwy. 2 off Steinhart Park Road. BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally in east pond.

Swan Creek 2A WMA (Saline) - 16 acres, 14W, 3N of Wilber. BBH, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Shallow.

Swan Creek 67 (Saline) - 39 acres, 3N, 1W of Swanton. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB. Largemouth bass -21-inch minimum length limit. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Owned by Lower Big Blue NRD.

Talmage Park Lake (Otoe) - 1 acre, Talmage. BLG, CCF, LMB.

Tanglewood (Lancaster) - 33 acres, ½N, 1W, ½S of Kramer. BBH, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB. Owned by Lower Platte South NRD. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake).

Teal Lake WMA (Lancaster) - 29 acres, 2S of Kramer. BBH, BLG, CCF, LMB. Electric motor or non-powered boats allowed. Subject to frequent fish kills due to low water levels.

Tecumseh City Pond (Johnson) - 2 acres, Tecumseh - N. 1st Street at fairgrounds. BLG, CCF, LMB. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit.

Timber Point (Butler) - 28 acres, 1S, 2E of Brainard. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, MUE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Handicap-accessible concrete boat ramp, boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Major fish kill in summer of 2014.

Tobacco Island WMA (Missouri River) (Cass) - 1/2E, 1S of Plattsmouth. BCF, BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, FRD, GOE, SNS. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake).

Towl Park Pond (Douglas) - 1 acres, Omaha - West Center Road and 93rd (enter at Paddock Road traffic light). BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Restricted to children under 16, adults with a child that is actively fishing, and adults 65 or older. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally.

Twin Lakes WMA (Seward) - 270 acres in two lakes, 2½N, ½W of Pleasant Dale. BBH, BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB, WAE, WHB. Concrete boat ramp on east lake. Area closed to fishing Oct. 15 through Dec. 31. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). West lake extremely shallow.

Twin Oaks WMA (Johnson) - 2 acres in two ponds, 2E, 4S of Tecumseh. BLG, LMB. Electric motors or non-powered boats allowed.

Twin Oaks WMA (Big Nemaha River) (Johnson) - 2E, 2S, 4W of Tecumseh. CAP, CCF, FCF. Halfmile walk-in access to river.

FFL Two Rivers SRA (Douglas) - 32 acres in seven pits, 1½S of Venice. BBH, BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB, RBT, SMB. Black bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Lake Nos. 3 and 4 designated as catch-and-release for all catfish species. Bullheads stocked in Lakes Nos. 6 and 7. Bullhead - daily bag limit of five. Trout fishing in Lake No. 5 best from April 1 to early June. Open dates for trout fishing will be published and posted. Trout fishing hours 7 a.m. to sunset. Daily trout tag required to attempt to take and to possess trout on entire area from March 1 through June 30. Cost of a tag is \$6, which allows harvest of four trout. Anglers may purchase up to three tags, and can possess up to 12 trout. An adult angler is allowed to have two children under 16 fish under their tag, but group still limited to four trout per tag. One pole or rod and reel per angler on Lake No. 5. Purchase trout tags at park office. No boats on Lake No. 5; other lakes electric motors or non-powered boats allowed. Wheelchair-accessible fishing deck on Lake No. 5. Cabins and camping.

Two Rivers SRA (Platte River) (Douglas) - 1½S of Venice. BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, FRD, SNS, Walkin river access.

FFL Verdon Lake SRA (Richardson) - 30 acres, ½W of Verdon. BBH, BLG, CCF, LMB. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Electric motor or non-powered boats allowed. Primitive camping.

FFL Wagon Train Lake SRA (Lancaster) - 315 acres, 2E of Hickman. BLG, CCF, CRP, FRD, LMB, MUE, RSF, WAE, WIP. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit; Wiper - daily bag limit of three, with no more than one fish 16 inches or greater. Primitive and modern camping. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Wheelchair-accessible pier.

Walnut Creek 2A (Saline) - 26 acres, ½E, 3 ½N of Crete. BBH, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Concrete boat ramp, boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Owned by Lower Big Blue NRD. Shallow. Primitive camping.



FFL Walnut Creek Reservoir (Sarpy) - 100 acres, Papillion - 96th and Neb. Hwy. 370. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, RSF, WAE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. No live baitfish may be used or possessed. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. City of Papillion lake. Area open 6 a.m.-10 p.m. Wheelchair-accessible fishing deck and island. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Concrete boat ramp. Primitive and modern camping.

Walnut Grove Park Pond (Douglas) - 1 acres, Milllard - Q Street across from Millard South High School. BLG, CCF, LMB. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length. Restricted to children under 16, adults with a child that is actively fishing and adults 62 or older.

Waterloo River Access (Elkhorn River) (Douglas) - SE corner of Elkhorn River and W. Maple Road. BBH, BUF, CAP, CCF, FCF, SNS. Owned by village of Waterloo. Canoe launch.

Weeping Water Pond (Cass) - 4 acres, Weeping Water - S of Clinton Street. BLG, CCF, LMB, RBT, WIP. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Rainbow trout stocked seasonally.

Wehrspann Lake Recreation Area (Sarpy) - 245 acres, Omaha - 156th and Giles Road. BBH, BCF, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, WAE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limt. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Wheelchair-accessible pier. Owned by Papio-Missouri River NRD. Area open 6 a.m.-10 p.m.

Whitehawk Lake (Douglas) - 30 acres, Omaha - 192 Road and F Street. BLG, CCF, LMB. Walk-in access only.

Wild Plum (Lancaster) - 16 acres, 1½N, ½W, of Kramer. BLG, CCF, LMB. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Owned by Lower Platte South NRD.

FFL Wildwood Lake (Lancaster) - 103 acres, 1W, 1½N of Agnew. BBH, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, WAE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit; all catfish - catch-and-release. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one ofer 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. No live baitfish may be used or possessed. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Primitive camping. Wheelchair-accessible deck. Owned by Lower Platte South NRD.

Willard L. Meyer Recreation Area (Swan Creek 5A) (Saline) - 95 acres, 3E, 2N of Tobias. BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB, SAE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in the daily bag. Owned by Lower Big Blue NRD. Wheelchair-accessible deck. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Primitive and modern camping.

Wilson Creek 2X WMA (Otoe) - 15 acres, 3E, 1½S of Otoe. BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB. Electric motor or non-powered boats allowed. Owned by Nemaha NRD. Shallow.

Wilson Creek 4F (Prairie Owl) (Otoe) - 38 acres, 2S, 1W, ¼S of Dunbar. BBH, BLG, CCF, CRP, LMB. Boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake). Owned by Nemaha NRD. Turbid.



Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in the daily bag. No live baitfish may be used or possessed. Wheelchair-accessible concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake).

FFL Zorinsky Lake Recreation Area (Douglas) - 255 acres, Omaha - 156th and F Streets. BLG, CAP, CCF, CRP, LMB, MUE, WAE. Largemouth bass - 21-inch minimum length limit. Walleye, Sauger, Saugeye - daily bag limit of four may include one from 15 through 18 inches and three over 18 inches or four over 18 inches, but no more than one over 22 inches in length allowed in daily bag. City of Omaha lake. Area open 5 a.m.-11 p.m. Wheelchair-accessible fishing deck. Concrete boat ramp. Boats restricted to 5 mph (no wake).

Remove all visible plants, animals, fish and mud from your boat, trailer or other equipment and dispose of in a suitable trash container or on dry land.





AFTER BOATING, BEFORE YOU LEAVE THE LAUNCH:

Drain water from bilge, live wells, ballast tanks and any other locations with water before leaving the launch. Invasive species can survive in small amounts of water.





LAUNCH TO GO BOATING:

Dry your boat, trailer and all equipment completely. Drying times vary depending on the weather. Dry at least 5 days during the summer.




